Abraham P. came to America in 1636. He settled in Situate Mass 1636. He bought land and moved to York, Maine in 1642 after marrying Judith. Abraham was councillor in 1645; Co Treasurer in 1654; associate Judge 1662

The following record, written in longhand, was found among Billing's-Preble papers, in W Eaton Ireland. Abraham Preble of Situate with deed in 1639, took Oath of Fidelity. Rem. to me (York) bought land fr. Tom Hoole 19/july/1645. Took O. of A. to Mass. Govt 22 Nov/1652. App. Commr to hold court at York. He married at Situate Judith dau of Elder Nathaniel Pilsden, a son Nathl Preble bap. at 2nd church of Situate Mar. 9, 1648 (Baxter Reads Vol 1) See wills of Prebles at Ser! points in Kent Eng. in N. Charles Preble was a small man, short and dark complexioned. Rachel weighed about 200 pounds. Charles kept a restaurant in Bath Me. before the Civil war. He volunteered as a cook during the war, developed malaria in the South, and was never well afterward. He moved to Lynn where he worked in a shoe shop.

Ebenzer, Mary and their son, William, were killed by the Indians, probably at West Wootwich or Bucksport. The other children were captured, carried to Canada and sold. Mahitable was carried to France and all trace of her lost.

Ebenzer Jr. was taken captive by the Indians with his brothers, sisters and kind girl (Sarah Flinn) on the day his parents were killed, June 9, 1758, and carried to Canada where he was sold to a French family. He remained there until after the capture of Quebec by the English in 1759 when he was redressed with the other children by his grand father Capt. Samuel Harnden. Ebenzer may have served in the Revolution as a private from York.
